#### 2022 Annual Report

2022 saw many highlights including:

- After participating in the STAR pre-pilot program (selected as one of four conservation districts in the State) 2022 saw the implementation of a three-year STAR PLUS program with Colorado Department of Agriculture. RCCD signed up five ranches from across the County who volunteered to participate in the program. An RCCD Board member, the Board's consultant and local NRCS staff met with each rancher, performed comprehensive soil sampling, analysis and interpretation, and developed an action plan based on each rancher's conservation goals. Financial incentives for implementing prescribed Best Management Practices were provided to participants.
- Worked with CSU Ag Water Program on Edge of Field water quality monitoring and soil moisture probe project.

- RCCD also continued its own soil health initiative which was started in 2019 with local funding sources. Each year the District has offered free comprehensive soil health analysis to the first ten ranching volunteers and then works with them to prescribe management practices to improve soil health.
- The District held its Annual Landowners Meeting in March 2022 with a series of excellent speakers on topics pertinent to Routt County Ag. A separate Local Working Group meeting was later held in the Fall to solicit input for NRCS and other ag programs going forward.
- The Long Range Plan for 2023-2025 was developed by the Board and disseminated to the local ag community via a series of events that were attended in the area.
- RCCD continued to work with many partners and participated on local boards including the Routt
  County Wildfire Mitigation Council, Upper Yampa River Watershed Group, Integrated Water
  Management Plan, County Master Plan Update, Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District,
  Community Ag Alliance, CSU Extension, Colorado Ag Water Alliance, and presented at events such
  as the Yampa Rendezvous and Routt County Fair.
- Participated with North Platte/White/Yampa Watershed Association.
- Purchased a 200 gallon pull behind weed sprayer and started a rental program for land owners.
- Purchased two soil health test kits to loan to landowners.


